Watermelon Seed Counting



Materials Intro: For today's activity, you will need:

- Watermelon slice template
- 2 boxes of raisins
- scissors

Note: You can use post it notes or cut out triangles and color them to make your own version. You can also draw on seeds using a marker!

- Cut out watermelon slices from the template and place them in order from 1-20
- 2. Starting with the number 1, place seeds on each slice; encouraging your child to say count while placing the seed on the watermelon.
- 3. When you've placed all the seeds on your watermelon slices you can do the following counting exercises with your child:
 - a. Starting with the first slice, count all the seeds on each slice and say the numbers aloud as you point to the seed
 - b. Count the total number of seeds on all the slices
 - c. Take two watermelon slices and have your child add up the total number of seeds
